The election in 2018 saw a surge in elected Democratic Socialists and as we continue to grow we may be able to demonstrate that we are a viable group. We were able to demonstrate that this year as we saw all of the democratic candidates drop out of the race to support Joe Biden and this is the second time we have witnessed the media consistently downplay how effective Bernie can be at beating Donald Trump and how he is a much superior candidate than the other democratic candidates. This demonstrates that there is a growing momentum and with more democratic socialists being elected the more momentum and potential to have a thriving Democratic Socialists Party.

If he has another four years, it is likely that he will be able to make another appointment to the supreme court, we will continue to see child detention centers along our border, he will completely gut the EPA, and it is likely that he will try to start another war to maintain power. Our entire system will crumble and it will take decades to repair the mental manipulation that he and Fox News will have done on the mentalities of people throughout our country. In addition to that, by re-electing Donald Trump, it will destroy every healthy relationship we have with every country on this planet by demonstrating that we are so happy with how well he did his first four years that we were willing to have him elected again. We also must understand that our country needs to recover from COVID-19 and this will take true leadership, which Donald Trump has failed to demonstrate.

20. Give an example of when you spoke truth to power. Who were the players, what were the stakes, and what did you do? >> Currently I am in the "minority" on the City Council. On Tuesday May 26, 2020, my colleague and I brought forward an extension to our current residential and commercial tenant eviction protection ordinance asking that we extend the protection to August 15th. We heard testimony from undocumented residents and other members of the public who asked that we extend the protections. After public comment, many of my colleagues questioned the legality of extending the eviction protections and made the excuse that we would be the only city in the county to do so and that other jurisdictions were not going to extend their protections, so why should we. I made the point that, as the government, we asked our residents to shelter in place and asked our businesses to close their doors to protect the health and safety of our residents. We know that the Shelter in Place Order will likely be extended, many of our residents are still out of work, and that by letting an eviction protection lapse that we would be putting many of our residents at risk. After having our businesses and residents comply with our County Health Orders, it is our responsibility to protect our workers and business owners as they try to get back on their feet again. Although many were reluctant to extend the protections at first, after an extensive conversation, we were able to get our colleagues to agree to extending the eviction protections to June 30th. They initially had the votes to completely vote this down, but by speaking truth to power on this issue, we were able to find a compromise.

21. Why should Bernie supporters vote for you to be their DNC Delegate? (max 50 words) >> As a Bernie delegate, and Mayor of Santa Cruz, I hope to use my position and influence to help others understand that the ideas and policies that Bernie Sanders represents are what our country needs now more than ever. The only way we are going to be able to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic is by having a leader who is going to take a new approach and motivate the youth of our country. In addition to that, COVID-19 has made it clear how important it is that we provide workers with a living wage and health care.
