In short, I fear several criticisms of 45 can be applied to Biden, except that Biden is a democrat and not as extreme. That should not be good enough for our country's highest office.

What differences if any do you think would result from a Biden administration compared to a second Trump administration? >> The courts would not be as flooded with republicans, several environmental regulations would go back into effect. Government agencies will be funded again. Racism and sexism would not be inflamed, but I'm not sure what will be done to transform our racist and sexist issues in our country under Biden. Hate crimes in places where our President speaks will not rise, and I would hope that Biden begins to move our country progressively forward instead of backwards.

Who were the players, what were the stakes, and what did you do? >> As an educator I often and regularly speak up for the disenfranchised youth. I am such a vocal advocate that I am now a leader in our Ethnic Studies course and the expansion of it to more grade levels and more subjects within our district. During the recall efforts, I often vocally challenged supporters including neighbors of the recall by sharing my family's personal story of being essentially evicted due to rent and deposit increase by 30%. I also strongly advocated for measure M and Prop 10 as well. Social justice is an important value to me.
